

WHAT TO DO?

About cyberbullying

1-DO NOT ANSWER

No need to feed the wire by responding, transferring or sharing offensive content.

2- PRESERVE EVIDENCE

This can be done by screenshot, or recording of emails. It may be interesting to use a bailiff to get a report



3- GET OFFENSIVE CONTENT REMOVED

Make a report

By alerting the social network.

If this fails, seize, the judge of expedited matters

Competent for urgency proceedings, the judge of expedited matters can order the removal of internet content.

For minors

The law provides for the right of minors to be forgotten. They can request directly to the website the withdrawal of content concerning them. In the event of refusal, the minor can notify the CNIL.

4- FILE A COMPLAINT

For minors

The complaint must be made in the presence of one or two parents or a legal representative.

Filing a complaint in a police service or by letter to the public prosecutor

When the facts are complex it is better to complain directly to the prosecutor, by sending a letter exposing the chronology and details of harassment.

To avoid complaint registration refusal, go to the police with a lawyer. If you send a letter to prosecutor seek legal advice beforehand.



5- PLATEFORME PHARO

Possibility to report content to the PHARO platform when it is pedophilia and child pornography, racism, anti-Semitism and xenophobia, incitement to racial hatred, ethnic and religious, terrorism, financial scam using internet.

Police and gendarmes assigned to the platform will alert the competent services. An investigation will then be conducted under the authority of the procureur.
